ARTICLE I, General Regulations

**CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF MALVERN, PENNSYLVANIA / PART II, GENERAL

Regulations / § 200-1. Definitions and interpretation.**

§ 200-1. Definitions and interpretation.

- A. Words and phrases, when used in this chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Vehicle Code of Pennsylvania, as now in force, or as hereafter amended, enacted or reenacted, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning.
- B. The term "legal holidays" as used in this chapter shall mean and include: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas.
- C. In this chapter, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular, and the masculine shall include the feminine and the neuter.

regulations.

§ 200-2. Manner of adopting permanent traffic and parking regulations.

All traffic and parking regulations of a permanent nature shall be enacted as ordinances or as parts of ordinances or as amendments to ordinances of the Borough.

CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF MALVERN, PENNSYLVANIA / PART II, GENERAL LEGISLATION / Chapter 200, VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC / ARTICLE I, General Regulations / § 200-3. Temporary and emergency regulations.

§ 200-3. Temporary and emergency regulations.

- A. The Mayor and/or the Police Department shall have the following powers to regulate traffic and parking temporarily and in time of emergency:
- (1) In the case of fire, flood, storm or other emergency, to establish temporary traffic and/or parking regulations.
 - (2) In the case of emergency or to facilitate public works or in the conduct of parades, processions or public events, to restrict or prohibit traffic and/or parking in limited areas for periods of not more than 72 hours.
- B. Such temporary and emergency regulations shall be enforced by the Mayor and the Police Department in the same manner as permanent regulations. Any person who shall operate or park a vehicle or tractor in violation of any such regulation or who shall move, remove, destroy, injure or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made to give notice of any such regulation shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable to the penalty set forth in the law or elsewhere in this chapter for a violation of such nature and, in case of a violation for which no specific penalty is set forth in the law or elsewhere in this chapter, to a fine of not more than \$10 and costs of prosecution, or shall be sentenced to imprisonment for a period not exceeding five days, as now or hereafter provided by law.

§ 200-4. Experimental regulations.

The Borough Council may, from time to time, designate places upon and along the highways in

the Borough where, for a period of not more than 90 days, specific traffic and/or parking regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be in force and effect and shall designate such locations by proper signs and markings. Such regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be effective just as if they had been specified in this chapter. No person shall operate or park a vehicle or tractor in violation of any such regulation, prohibition or restriction, and no person shall move, remove, destroy or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made by authority of this section. Any person who shall violate any provision of this section shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable to the penalty set forth in the law or elsewhere in this chapter for a violation of such nature and, in case of a violation for which no specific penalty is set forth in the law or elsewhere in this chapter, to a fine of not more than five days, provided that the purpose of this section is to allow for the test and experimental determination of the feasibility and desirability of permanent changes in the ordinances of the Borough relative to traffic and parking.

§ 200-5. Authority of peace officers.

The peace officers of the Borough are hereby given authority to direct traffic on the highways of the Borough and at intersections thereof.

§ 200-6. Bicycle riding.

No person shall ride a bicycle in any street without having hands on the handlebars. Bicycles may be ridden on Borough sidewalks. However, pedestrians are given the right-of-way on sidewalks at all times. Any person who shall violate any provision of this section shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$2 and costs of prosecution or shall be sentenced to imprisonment for a period not exceeding 24 hours as now or hereafter provided by law.

§ 200-7. Skateboard riding. [Amended 11-9-1976 by Ord. No. 76-7]

- A. It shall be unlawful to operate a skateboard upon any Borough highway, street, sidewalk or alley in a dangerous or reckless manner so as to endanger the property or physical safety of any person.
- B. Unlawful and/or hazardous use shall include but shall not be limited to the following:
 - (1) Not yielding to pedestrians, bicycles or motor vehicles.
 - (2) Skateboarding on the following roadways: King Street, Bridge Street and Warren Avenue. These roadways are collector roads heavily utilized by pedestrians.
 - (3) Skateboarding from a driveway (public or private) onto a public thoroughfare. The risk of collision with a motor vehicle is unreasonably high if such practice is permitted.
 - (4) Skateboarding from one street onto an intersecting street without making a complete stop, whether or not a stop sign installed for vehicular traffic is in place. A child on a skateboard is not easily seen by vehicular traffic approaching perpendicularly.
- C. The Police Department of the Borough of Malvern is charged with the responsibility of enforcing this section. Upon visual observation of a violation of this section, any uniformed police officer shall have the power and duty to cause the discontinuance of such unlawful use and to cite the operator for violation of this section by providing such operator a written citation on a form used for that purpose and containing a fine of \$2. The citation form shall state that the fine is payable within 48 hours at the office of the Borough Manager, Borough Hall, unless such person desires a hearing before the District Justice of the Peace. In that event, the fine shall be paid to the Borough Manager, as aforesaid, except that the Borough Manager will escrow such fine in an account designed for that purpose pending disposition of the hearing before the District Justice of the Peace. Demand for such hearing shall, as aforesaid, be made within the forty-eight-hour period. Thereafter, Borough Manager shall have 30 days in which to institute the appropriate proceedings before the District Justice of the Peace.

§ 200-8. Operation of minibikes, miniscooters, motorcycles and snowmobiles. [Amended

8-30-1977 by Ord. No. 77-5]

- A. It shall be unlawful for any person, persons, firm or corporation to operate minibikes, miniscooters, motorcycles and snowmobiles on any Borough-owned property or upon park and recreational areas leased, maintained or operated by the Borough of Malvern. Entry upon and exit from designated parking areas will be permitted by properly licensed operators operating properly inspected and properly registered minibikes, miniscooters and motorcycles.
- B. Any person, persons, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this section shall be liable on conviction thereof to a fine or penalty of not less than \$15 nor more than \$300 for each and every offense, plus the cost of restoration of property damage, and in default of the payment of such fine, any person, persons, firm or corporation so convicted may be imprisoned in the county jail for a period not exceeding 90 days.

§ 200-9. Use and possession of motor vehicles on certain Borough property prohibited. [Amended 11-21-1995 by Ord. No. 95-6]

No motor vehicle shall be operated on or brought onto any part of the Borough-owned property (Water Works Park) which is not improved with a paved (i.e., blacktopped) roadway. For purposes of this section, the Water Works Park includes all that tract of land which is owned by the Borough, part of the parcel identified by Chester County as real estate tax parcel 2-4-361 and located east of Ruthland Avenue (as constructed), east of the parcel the Borough has leased (at the time of enactment of this section) to Harron Communications Corp. and east of the parcel owned (at the time of enactment of this section) by the Laymen's Weekend Retreat. Any and all persons, firms and/or corporations violating this section shall be liable to a fine or civil penalty of not less than \$25 nor more than \$150 for the first offense and not less than \$150 nor more than \$500 for each and every subsequent offense.

CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF MALVERN, PENNSYLVANIA / PART II, GENERAL LEGISLATION / Chapter 200, VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC / ARTICLE II, Traffic Regulations / § 200-10. Motor vehicles not to be driven on sidewalks.

§ 200-10. Motor vehicles not to be driven on sidewalks.

No person shall operate a motor vehicle or tractor upon any sidewalk in the Borough, nor shall any person operate a motor vehicle upon or across any sidewalk except in order to gain access to or egress from a driveway or alley at such locations where the curb, if such sidewalk is curbed, shall have been properly cut down for the purpose. Any person who shall violate any provision of this section shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$50 and costs of prosecution or shall be sentenced to imprisonment for a period not exceeding 10 days as now or hereafter provided by law.

§ 200-11. Speed limits established.

- A. No person shall operate any vehicle or tractor upon any of the streets and highways of the Borough at a greater speed than is reasonable and proper having regard to the width, traffic and use thereof or so as to endanger the property or life or limb of any person.
- B. The speed limits for the streets or portions of streets within the Borough are hereby established for those streets or portions of streets listed herein.
- C. Any person who shall operate a vehicle or tractor at a speed in excess of that established therefor upon any highway or portion thereof specified in this section shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$10 and costs of prosecution or shall be sentenced to imprisonment for a period not exceeding five days as now or hereafter provided by law.

§ 200-12. Traffic signals at certain intersections.

- A. Official traffic control signals shall be erected (or if heretofore erected are hereby ratified) at the intersections listed herein. Traffic at such designated intersections shall be directed by such signals.
- B. Any operator of a vehicle or tractor who shall disobey the directions of any traffic signal shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$5 and costs of prosecution or shall be sentenced to imprisonment for a period not exceeding three days as now or hereafter provided by law.

§ 200-13. One-way streets established.

- A. Upon those streets and parts of streets and in those alleys listed and described herein, vehicular traffic shall move only in the indicated direction when signs indicating the direction of traffic are erected and maintained at every intersection where movement in the opposite direction is prohibited.
- B. Any person who shall operate a motor vehicle or tractor upon any highway or portion thereof hereby established as a one-way highway other than in the direction hereby established for traffic thereon shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$15 and costs of prosecution or shall be sentenced to imprisonment for a period not exceeding 10 days, as now or hereafter provided by law.

- A. No operator of any motor vehicle shall make a U-turn upon any of the streets described herein.
- B. Any person who shall violate any provision of this section shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$10 and costs of prosecution or shall be sentenced to imprisonment for a period not exceeding five days, as now or hereafter provided by law.

§ 200-15. Through highways established.

- A. The highways indicated and listed herein are hereby established as through highways, and the operator of every vehicle or tractor upon approaching any such highway at any intersection thereof (except for such intersections where there are now or shall hereafter be located official traffic signals) shall come to a full stop, within a reasonable distance, before entering any such through highway.
- B. Any operator of a vehicle or tractor who shall fail to come a full stop, within a reasonable distance, before entering any such through highway, as hereinabove required, shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$5 and costs of prosecution or shall be sentenced to imprisonment for a period not exceeding three days, as now or hereafter provided by law.

§ 200-16. Stop intersections established. [Amended 1-17-1989 by Ord. No. 89-5]

- A. The intersections specified herein are established as stop intersections, and official stop signs shall be erected (or are hereby confirmed if heretofore erected) in such a position as to face traffic approaching the second-named street upon the first-named street, in the direction or directions therein indicated. All vehicles and tractors approaching any such intersection upon the first-named street in the direction or directions therein indicated in each case, shall come to a full stop, within a reasonable distance, before entering any such intersection. Stop intersections and stop signs may be established or discontinued by an ordinance amending only the schedule below.
- B. Any operator of a vehicle or tractor who shall fail to come to a full stop, within a reasonable distance, before entering any stop intersection, as hereinabove required, shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$5 and costs of prosecution or shall be sentenced to imprisonment for a period not exceeding three days, as now or hereafter provided by law.

§ 200-17. Use restrictions.

- A. No truck, trailer, tractor-trailer or other commercial vehicle having a gross weight of 7,000 pounds or more shall be operated on the named streets or roads listed herein, except for the purpose of delivering or picking up goods, wares, merchandise or household effects to or from properties within the Borough. [Adopted 2-3-1970 by Ord. No. 174]
- B. Any person who shall violate any provision of this section shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$50 and costs of prosecution or shall be sentenced to imprisonment for a period not exceeding 10 days as now or hereafter provided by law.

§ 200-18. Unlawful to operate motor vehicles on highways closed for construction or repair.

It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any vehicle or tractor upon any highway in the Borough that is under construction, resurfacing or repair, in disregard of any official sign, barricade or notice that the same is closed to vehicular traffic. Any person who shall violate any provision of this section shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$25 and costs of prosecution or shall be sentenced to imprisonment for a period not exceeding 10 days as now or hereafter provided by law.

The operator of any motor vehicle involved in an accident in the Borough and required by law to report such accident to any department or agency of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, or any other person required to make such report, shall, at the time of making such report to the commonwealth, make a written report to the Chief of Police of the Borough containing the same information. Any person failing to make the report to the Chief of Police hereby required shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$10 and costs of prosecution or shall be sentenced to imprisonment for a period not exceeding five days as now or hereafter provided by law.

- B. Any person who shall violate any provision of this chapter shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$15 and costs of prosecution, or shall be sentenced to imprisonment for a period not exceeding 10 days, as now or hereafter provided by law.

 - (2) The date and hour of such violation.
 - (3) The state license number of such vehicle.

The failure of such owner or operator to make such payment at police headquarters or in any fine box within said 24 hours, the owner or operator of such vehicle shall pay a fine of \$5, the same shall save such violator from the penalties hereinafter provided for violation of the provisions of this chapter.
