# 1. MINUTES

#### 2. NEW BUSINESS

• Exxon Property Discussion for Official Map

Council Member Mark Niemiec discussed the possibility of adding the property located on King Street to the Official Map in order to preserve it for a possible municipal parking lot and offer EV charging capabilities.

The MPC discussed the feasibility of the property being used for parking and what the hurdles may be in achieving this.

At this time the MPC does not feel this property should be added to the Official Map due to the fact that the Borough does not have a clear vision or plan as to what can actually be done on the property.

• Greenway Trail Connection

Council Member Mark Niemiec presented an alternative path from Randolph Woods to connect to Warren Avenue. This path would come up First Avenue instead of along Second Avenue.

The MPC discussed both the pros and cons of moving the path along First Avenue.

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At this time the MPC feels moving the path to First Avenue would be a cause for public safety due to the lack of sidewalks and the current traffic load First Avenue brings. Second Avenue has a natural green path along the Malvern Retreat property, and the road has less traffic on it.
