Malvern's Sanitary Sewer System Gets a Much-Needed Inspection

Revealing Cooking Oil!

Over the past several months, you may have noticed work trucks bearing the letters "USG", out and about around the Borough. This is Utility Services Group, Inc. a company that has been contracted to inspect all of the Borough-owned sanitary sewer pipes using CCTV technology.

Once this survey is completed, our engineer will review the footage to identify areas needing maintenance, with special attention to cracks and breaks that allow the infiltration of clean groundwater into the system that gets passed on to the Valley Forge Sewer Authority as wastewater. This is costing the Borough substantial processing fees. Our initial view of the camera footage also shows areas that are becoming heavily blocked by household cooking grease and oil. These blockages must be flushed out regularly, which is an expensive process.

One way our residents can help is for you to dispose of your cooking grease and oil properly. Please do not pour grease down the drain or even through your garbage disposal. Instead, allow the oil to cool, pour it into a container, close it with a tight-fitting lid, and then toss the container into the trash bin.

Thank you for your help with this request. We look forward to keeping you informed as we continue with this important project.

AQUA PA CUSTOMER-OWNED LEAD SERVICE LINE REPLACEMENT PROGRAM

Over the past few years, AQUA in partnership with the Pennsylvania General Assembly has replaced many customer-owned (lead) water service lines throughout the Borough at no charge to the homeowner. This program is still available to those homes with lead or galvanized service lines.

Under the AQUA Customer Lead Service Line Replacement Program, AQUA will identify customer-owned service lines that are lead or galvanized, enter into an agreement with the Customer to replace the Customer-owned portion of the service line, and restore the Customer's property at no direct cost to the customer, dedicate the newly installed customer portion of the service line back to the Customer, and provide a warranty on the work completed to replace the Customer-owned lead or galvanized service line.

AQUA's Replacement Program is made up of two parts: (1) replacements in connection with a main replacement project, and (2) replacements per Customer request not associated with a main replacement project.

First, don't forget to clean out your dryer vents as part of your spring-cleaning routine (this should be done at least once a year). Be sure you are always checking your electrical cords for any frays and ensure that all your electrical equipment is in working order. For all of our grill masters out there, be sure to inspect your grill to ensure that there are no worn parts or leaks. Lastly, be sure to replace your smoke and carbon monoxide detector batteries, as this should be done twice a year; make certain you are testing your alarms monthly.



With the Spring weather in full force (well, somewhat), be sure to visit us during these special events:

Property Maintenance in Malvern

Please Keep Sidewalks, Walkways and Streets Unobstructed

As the hedges, bushes and flowers grow along the sidewalk at your property; please make sure that they don't obstruct the sidewalk. This makes it difficult, not to mention dangerous, for pedestrians using the sidewalks. In light of Malvern Borough's size, both residents and visitors alike, use the sidewalks to get around. All vegetation along sidewalks must be trimmed back just behind the paved area. In addition, where vegetation is planted near road intersections, keep them trimmed back so they're not sight hazard to motorists attempting to go through those intersections.

If you have trees that hang over the sidewalk and road, they must be trimmed up so that there is at least eight feet from the sidewalk to the bottom of the branches and at least thirteen feet from the street to the lowest branches.



While clearing back the hedges and bushes from your sidewalks and walkways, be sure to have a look at the walkway and sidewalk blocks. If they've been lifted up by trees or frost heave during the winter there is a half inch or greater difference between blocks, they should be repaired or replaced to eliminate potential trip hazards between the blocks.

The **2015 International Property Maintenance Code**, as well as the **The Code of the Borough of Malvern**, requires that exterior property areas be kept clean and "free from hazardous conditions." All residents and businesses that have hedges, bushes and trees along sidewalks and streets must help keep them safe by ensuring that the sidewalks and streets are not obstructed.

Malvern King Street Revitalization Task Force

Task Force Launches Malvern King Street Revitalization

Early last year, in accordance with Malvern's 10 year Community plan, the Borough Council began the important work of strengthening Malvern's downtown commercial district. Council person Lynne Frederick and Borough Manager Tiffany Loomis researched best practices from surrounding communities in order to explore ways to revitalize downtown Malvern. Then, a Task Force was initiated.

In the interest of ensuring the existing business mix would thrive, and with an eye toward attracting new, unique, and complementary businesses, the Task Force embarked on a plan for downtown Malvern based on the tried and proven principles of the [Main Street America](#) program; principles that have successfully transformed downtown districts across the country.

After extensive preliminary research work that culminated in a [Charter of Recommendations](#), which was presented to and approved by the Borough Council in fall 2023, the group filed Articles of Incorporation with the Commonwealth of PA for Malvern King Street Revitalization, Inc., and subsequently filed for 501(c)3 Charitable Organization designation with the Internal Revenue Service.

We established a Board of Directors, developed bylaws, and set our mission:

To lead the revitalization of Malvern's King Street into a vibrant, thriving hub of community life. Through strategic collaboration with local businesses, residents, and the Borough, we are dedicated to revitalizing the core of our town. By preserving our historical heritage and fostering a welcoming atmosphere, we aim to create a dynamic destination for commerce, culture, and connection that will inspire both residents and visitors to embrace the essence of Malvern.

With the organizational structure and seed funding from Borough Council in place, the Malvern King Street Revitalization (MKSR) Board of Directors contracted with [Derck & Edson](#), a planning and landscape architecture firm, to help collect and coalesce data, and assist the Board and Borough in the development of a comprehensive strategic plan for downtown Malvern.

This initiative can only succeed with the involvement of residents. Our immediate goals for 2024 include the distribution of a survey inviting input from our business and residential community. Feedback from our neighbors will be critical in developing a vision for our downtown district. Subsequently, we will be looking for volunteers to lead and participate in a number of initiatives. Additionally, it is our hope that current and future funding will enable us to work with downtown businesses and other stakeholders to implement the forthcoming strategic plan.

Environmental Advisory Committee

As borough residents know, Malvern is a wonderful blend of homes, shops, and natural lands. Being very walkable is a key point of what attracts people to our town, and one is never far from the relaxing scenes of nature and the many birds and animals that help create that. In hopes of encouraging native bird species and encouraging residence to support natural plantings and environments for them, Malvern became the 41st Pennsylvania Bird Town in November of 2023. The stated mission of Bird Town Pennsylvania is to “work in partnership with local municipalities and like-minded organizations to promote community-based conservation actions to create a healthier, more sustainable environment for birds, wildlife, and people.” The program has four certification levels: Green, Bronze, Silver and Gold which are based on completion of 6 strategy areas including Municipal Actions, School District Actions, Community Engagement, Habitat Enhancement, Collaborations and Advocacy.

For Malvern, the Bird Town committee is a group of seven individuals, which includes two student members of Great Valley High School, working with the Environmental Advisory Council as associate members. These members act as liaisons to publicize the borough’s Bird Town activities to help facilitate the growth of habitats for birds in Malvern. Student members will lead at the school district level. The Malvern EAC regularly writes articles for the Malvern Borough Newsletter about environmentally friendly practices.

Topics have included: planting with natives, caring for lawns naturally, and the Homegrown National Park initiative. Since becoming a Bird Town, the EAC has written about 1) gardening to create habitat; 2) light pollution and its impacts on nocturnal ecology, and 3) the importance of maintaining “winter gardens” to leave cover for birds.

Among some of the actions that Malvern Bird Town have sponsored since its inception included a guided bird walk, with the assistance of members of the Valley Forge Audubon Society, completion of an eBird checklist and distribution of over 100 “make your own bird feeder” kits at the annual Christmas on King event, creation of a Bluebird trail and habitat maintenance with the CRC Watersheds Association.

Malvern Bird Town was recently notified that our efforts so far have allowed us to obtain the next level of participation, the Bronze Level. As we plan more events and information sessions through 2024, including advocacy, a photography contest, and student volunteer opportunities, we anticipate making the next Bird Town level, Silver, by year end.

Shade Tree Commission

Our Spring bare root Tree Planting Event was a great success with 24 trees distributed to our residents for planting throughout the Borough. These trees were purchased by the Borough from the Pennsylvania Horticultural Society as part of their TreeVitalize program and provided free to our residents. The Shade Tree Commission also provides expert advice on how to select, site, plant and care for these trees. We are continuing our efforts to augment the treescapes of the major routes into Malvern. This spring we will be replacing the large trees that had to be taken down along Warren Avenue and Roberts Lane. The Valley Creek Church will be adding some trees as well. We are also working toward adding several trees along King Street in the fall.

The Shade Tree Commission has been busy partnering with the EAC, Parks and Recreation and Historical Commissions on several ongoing projects. These include the planting of native trees and plants at the Jennings Lane construction site, new plantings at Borough Hall, and potentially expanding plantings within our parks. These efforts support the work of Malvern’s Bird Town and Tree City initiatives. We are also working on locating some of Malvern’s trees of historical and horticultural interest to develop a self-guided walking tour. Volunteers are most welcome to help with any of these projects! Please contact the STC or Borough Hall if you would like to lend a hand.


